# **HMS Bulletin**

October 25, 2024



This is a reminder that starting November 1st, backpacks and bookbags must be stored in student lockers throughout the school day. Students must leave backpacks in their lockers until dismissal time. This decision has been made with student and staff safety in mind. While we understand that backpacks can be convenient for carrying books, computers, and supplies, eliminating them will help create a safer environment for everyone.

# Reasons for this change:

- Safety and Security: Requiring all bags to remain in lockers allows
  us to monitor things that may be brought to school that should not
  be. It also helps us respond more quickly in case of an emergency.
- 2. Clutter-Free Environment: Without backpacks, our hallways and classrooms will be less cluttered, making it easier for everyone to navigate the school safely.
- Focus on Learning: By limiting personal items, we hope to encourage a focus on education and interaction and minimize distractions during school hours.

#### **Grade-level locker visit times:**

- 8th Grade: Arrival at school, after period 2, before & after lunch, and dismissal
- 7th Grade: Arrival at school, after period 2, before & after lunch, and dismissal
- 6th grade: Arrival at school, before & after lunch, before period 6, and dismissal

## Helpful Tips and Reminders to make the transition a smooth one:

- 1. Students should clean out their bookbags of anything they do not need.
- 2. Students must unpack their bookbags and leave materials and things unused inside their lockers. This includes extra folders, paper, notebooks, etc.
- 3. Helping your students develop an organizational system will also make the transition smooth. For example, students may want to organize a morning binder and an afternoon binder. Zip binders are also an excellent organizational tool.
- 4. Water bottles can also be stored in lockers when not in use throughout the day.
- 5. Cell phones can also remain in lockers as they must be off and away per the Howard County policy.

The idea is not to carry everything in the backpack around with students all day but to minimize the amount of things they carry around.

We understand that this may be an adjustment for students. We encourage students to learn their locker combinations, unpack their bookbags, organize their belongings, and practice opening their locker.

Safety is our top priority, and we appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we implement this school-wide expectation. Please immediately contact us with any questions, concerns, or locker trouble.

Attention Hammond Middle School Families,

As part of a grant from the State of Maryland's Connected Devices Program, our school is partnering with the **Bright Minds Foundation** and the Howard County Government to provide qualifying families with one free Chromebook and charger per household. Your family can use this free new HP Chromebook to connect with our schools, access community services, or for any other purpose that would benefit you.

In order to qualify for a free Chromebook and charger, you must meet the following criteria:

- Your family has not already received a free device from one of these organizations: Community Action Council of Howard County, Howard County Office of Children and Families, or Making Change;
- You are the parent or legal guardian of a student currently enrolled in HCPSS;
- You meet one of the income qualifications outlined on the application form; and,
- The application form is fully completed.

If you qualify for a Chromebook and have completed the Google Form application, you will be notified by Hammmond Middle School when the device is available in November/December for pick up. At that time, an adult family member (at least 18 years old) will need to come to the school to receive the device. When you pick up the device, you will receive information about setting up the device and how to access technical support. These are not HCPSS devices, and will not come loaded with any HCPSS educational applications. HCPSS is not responsible or liable for the operation, loss, or repair of your Chromebook or charger. Families will be responsible for their own internet service. Families will have 5 days to exchange any non-functioning devices. # Complete or Renew Your FARMs Application by October 31st

HCPSS participates in the Free and Reduced-price Meals (FARMs) program.

Qualification is based on family size and income, and enrollment is confidential.

Participation in FARMs qualifies students for a wide range of opportunities and resources beyond breakfast and lunch, including free college applications, free or reduced JumpStart tuition, discounted internet through the Comcast Internet Essentials program, and more.

Families must submit a new application every school year by Oct. 31. During the first 30 school days, students with FARMs eligibility from the prior school year will continue to receive benefits. Any student whose family has not filled out an application by the 30th school day will have their status changed to full pay until a new application is received.

Parents/guardians are highly encouraged to fill out the applications as soon as possible. It is very important that applications are filled out accurately and completely. Families can:

- Apply by mail: Paper applications can be picked up in the Food and Nutrition Service Office (5451 Beaverkill Rd, Columbia, MD 21044).

While you are still welcome to join us, we will be reviewing older data for these students. Additionally, MCAP scores, which apply to all students, were recently sent home and will be discussed during the presentation.

During our "Data & Dinner" event, we will share your child's most recent Reading and Math MAP data from this fall's September sessions. Each registered participant will receive a personalized folder with your student's data and a space for reflection. We'll guide you through interpreting the scores and exploring ways to support further academic growth.

To ensure all families can attend, we will offer a **children's area** during the session. Kids can enjoy a showing of *Monster's Inc.* and participate in supplemental activities. Please be sure to account for any additional children attending in your registration.

#### Please perform daily health checks and keep sick children at home:

- Temperature of 100 degrees or higher
- Headache
- Chills
- Sore Throat
- Body Aches
- Abdominal Cramps
- Diarrhea

Nausea/Vomiting

If your child requires medication (prescription or over the counter) during the 2024-2025 school year, your child's health care provider must complete a medication form and/or an Epi-Pen Care form. All prescribed medications must be in properly labeled containers that include the following information:

- Student name
- Medication name
- Dose to be given
- Time & Frequency of medication
- Prescriber's name & signature
- Date of medication order

Pharmacy labels will usually contain this information. Over-the-counter medications should be in new, unopened containers labeled with the student's name.
