Attention Rising 9th Graders

High School 2025-2026 Course Registration, Dec. 16, 2024 - Jan. 14, 2025

High school course selection for the 2025-2026 academic year will open Monday, Dec. 16, 2024 8:00 AM, and run through Tuesday, Jan. 14, 2025 4:00 PM, for current 8-11 grade students.

Beginning Dec. 16, students and their parents/guardians may view teachers' course recommendations and submit course requests and alternate requests by <u>logging into HCPSS Connect Synergy</u>, selecting Course Request from the left panel, and <u>following the directions online</u>.

Please note:

- Guides on how to complete Course Requests are available online.
- Students and their parents/guardians should use the <u>Catalog of Approved High School Courses</u> to review course selections, taking careful note of descriptions and prerequisites.

- Students and their parents/guardians can adjust a teacher course recommendation by using the dropdown to select the preferred course level.
- Students and their parents/guardians will add electives to ensure they
 have seven credits of primary requests and three alternates. Alternate
 selections should be added in priority order.
- If you want to change a course and there is not an option available in
 the drop down menu, parents/guardians should download and complete
 the High School Course Change Request Form and submit a paper
 copy to their child's school counselor. Forms received during the course
 registration period will receive priority during scheduling. Requests
 received after this time will be accommodated if space is available.

Important Dates:

- Dec. 16, 2024: Course registration opens at 8:00 AM.
- Jan. 14, 2025: Course registration closes at 4:00 PM.
- Jan. 15 Feb. 19, 2025:
 - Current 8th graders will meet with their middle school counselors to review student course requests through scheduled counselor/student appointments.
 - Current 9th-11th graders will review individual requests and progress toward graduation requirements through scheduled counselor/student appointments.
- Spring 2025: Students and parents/guardians will have access to their list of registered courses by the end of the current school year.
- August 2025: Final 2025-2026 student schedules will be available prior to the start of the school year.

HCPSS Emergency Notifications

Impact Aid Forms Due Dec. 20

Parents/guardians who work on a federal property in Maryland and/or are a member of a uniformed service can qualify HCPSS to receive federal funding by completing the Impact Aid form online by Dec. 20. Impact Aid supplements the HCPSS operating budget to enhance the teaching and learning that takes place in Howard County classrooms.

Health Room News

Please perform daily health checks and keep sick children at home:

- Temperature of 100 degrees or higher
- Headache

- Chills
- Sore Throat
- Body Aches
- Abdominal Cramps
- Diarrhea
- Nausea/Vomiting

If your child requires medication (prescription or over the counter) during the 2024-2025 school year, your child's health care provider must complete a <u>medication</u> form and/or an <u>Epi-Pen Care</u> form. All prescribed medications must be in properly labeled containers that include the following information:

- Student name
- Medication name
- Dose to be given
- Time & Frequency of medication
- Prescriber's name & signature
- Date of medication order

Pharmacy labels will usually contain this information. Over-the-counter medications should be in new, unopened containers labeled with the student's name.

Reporting your child's absence

Need to report an absence? Please email your absence notes/questions to:

HMSabsence@hcpss.org">hcpss.org or send in a signed parent/guardian note.

The email should include the student's name, the parent's name, the date(s) or period(s) (if absence is a partial day) of the absence, and the reason for the absence. The email must be received within 5 days of the absence. Requests for changes to attendance submitted after the 5 day deadline may not be honored.

Please Note: Absences are unexcused until an email or note is received.
