#### Hello, HMS students and families,

As we approach the end of the school year, we are noticing a rash of Chromebooks with damage not due to normal wear and tear. We have also heard talk of various TikTok challenges that involve damaging Chromebooks in various ways, including trying to set them on fire. Causing a fire at school will result in a high level of consequences per the Howard County Student Code of Conduct.

This email is to remind everyone that having a Chromebook is a privilege, and with that privilege comes various responsibilities. There are instances where accidental damage to a screen or port might occur, and the county has instituted a policy that considers those situations. If, however, damage is being intentionally inflicted, this violates the county's technology use policy and could lead to administrative consequences in addition to financial charges being assessed.

We'd also like to remind families that students should charge their Chromebooks nightly and bring their chargers to school. Each teacher has a limited number of computer chargers in their classroom.

#### \*\*Reminder: No Outside Food Permitted

We kindly remind all parents and guardians that students are not allowed to share food or beverages in school. This policy helps us maintain a safe and healthy environment for all students, especially those with food allergies or dietary restrictions. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

#### **News from our Health Room**

Dear Parent/Guardian,

If your student has medication in the health room, those medications will need to be picked up by noon on June 18th. If your child will need to take medication during the coming school year, medication order forms can be found on the HCPSS website at <a href="https://www.hcpss.org/health/medications/">https://www.hcpss.org/health/medications/</a>

\*If your child will be in band, orchestra, or chorus next year, consider requesting the doctor to include a "self-carry/self-administer" order for your child's emergency medications (epipens, inhalers) for extended day and weekend field trips.

Orders for each new school year must be dated on or after July 1. All medications must be in containers properly labeled with the following information:

- Student name
- Medication name
- Dosage to be given
- Time and frequency of medication
- Date of medication order
- Prescriber's name
- Expiration date of medication

\*\*\*Over-the-counter medications such as cold, allergy, and headache/pain medications also require a medication form completed by a physician and those medications should be brought to the health room in new, unopened containers.

\*Medications should be delivered to school by a parent/guardian to assure safe arrival. Students should not transport medications.

\*\*Medication remaining at the end of the school year should be picked up by the parent/guardian by noon on June 18th. Any medication not picked up will be destroyed.


# **Summer Meal Program Overview**

To continue meeting the growing need to feed hungry children and families in Howard County and fill the nutritional gap over the summer months, the Howard County Public School System announces its **free summer meal program**, which will run weekdays June 23-Aug. 1, 2025. Meals will be served only on days schools are open and there will be no meal service Friday, July 4.

There are no applications, enrollment or fees to participate in this program, however children must be present to receive free meals.

Meals will be provided at no cost to any HCPSS students, as well as any children aged 18 and under. In addition, free meals will be provided to all students participating in HCPSS summer programs.

# **REMINDERS:**

### Late check in process for students:

Students now log in electronically upon arrival, and their entry time is recorded directly in Synergy. Parents no longer need to come into the school to sign in their child.

Important: Per Policy 9010-IP, absences and tardies are marked unexcused unless the school receives a note or email within five (5) school days of the student's return.

Please send all attendance notifications to HMSAbsence@hcpss.org, including your child's full name, grade, and date of absence/tardiness. Students may still bring a parent or doctor's note to the attendance secretary.

### Reporting your child's absence

Need to report an absence? Please email your absence notes/questions to: HMSabsence@hcpss.org or send in a signed parent/guardian note. The email should include the student's name, the parent's name, the date(s) or period(s) (if absence is a partial day) of the absence, and the reason for the absence. The email must be received within 5 days of the absence. Requests for changes to attendance submitted after the 5 day deadline may not be honored.

Please Note: Absences are unexcused until an email or note is received.
