Solar Eclipse Safety: On Monday, April 8, 2024, a partial solar eclipse will be visible in Howard County, Maryland. This partial eclipse will begin at 2:05 pm, with maximum coverage at 3:21 pm, and end around 4:35 pm.

School dismissals will occur during the solar eclipse, with Tier 2 elementary and middle schools dismissing during the height of the eclipse. Some students will already be home by that time.

Safety during a solar eclipse is important. Please review this information with your child(ren) to ensure safety at home:

- Never look directly at the Sun, especially during a solar eclipse.
- It is dangerous to look directly at the Sun and can cause permanent damage to the eyes.
- Do not look at the Sun through sunglasses, telescope, or binoculars.

We encourage you and your family to read more about solar eclipses and safety and enjoy experiencing this rare, exciting phenomenon. 2024-2025 Bus Service Registration: To help HCPSS plan for student transportation needs for the 2024-2025 school year, bus service registration for the 2024-2025 school year will open for parents/guardians of eligible students on April 8. Families will be notified on April 4 via districtwide email/website post with translations, and a reminder in the HCPSS News email to families on April 10. Families will be asked to complete registration by May 31 to better inform development of routes and busing needs. Last Day of School Scheduled: HCPSS used three inclement weather days this school year, and as such, the <u>last day of school</u> for students in full-day Pre-K through grade 11 is now scheduled to be Friday, June 14, with June 12-14 being three-hour early dismissals. The last day for half-day Pre-K/RECC students is currently Tuesday, June 11. Separately, the <u>last day for all high school seniors</u> is May 22.

From The Health Room

Springtime is here and we are beginning to see a lot of children with allergy symptoms in the health room. Per HCPSS policy, the health room staff is not allowed to administer medications without doctor's orders; therefore, we suggest that parents treat their children at home before school to help manage their allergies throughout the school day.

Updated COVID-19 Guidance

The Maryland Department of Health and Maryland State Department of Education recently endorsed the CDC's Respiratory Virus Guidance, and no longer require a 5-day quarantine period for COVID-19. Students and staff are still expected to remain home if they are experiencing symptom(s) associated with any communicable disease.


College Fair
