

# Student Dress Code (Policy 9210)

With warmer weather approaching we would like to remind students and parents of the Howard County Dress Code Policy. HCPSS believes that maintaining a respectful and responsible dress code contributes to a positive school culture. We kindly ask for your support in ensuring that your child adheres to the dress code policy each day.

The following items are prohibited:

- Attire that depicts profanity, hate speech, obscenity, the use of weapons, or violence
- Attire that promotes the use of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or other illegal or harmful products
- Attire that promotes, implies or contains sexually suggestive messages
- Attire that exposes or reveals the chest, midriff, pelvic/groin area, and buttocks
- Visible underwear or bathing suits (Visible waistbands or straps on undergarments worn under other clothing are not a violation.)
- Helmets or headgear that obscure the face, except as a religious obligation, observation of a religious holiday, or for a school-related activity

- Attire that depicts gang affiliation
- Attire that contains language or symbols that demean an identifiable person or group or otherwise infringes on the rights of others
- Attire that causes or is likely to cause a material disruption, a substantial disorder to school activities or the orderly operation of the school, or an invasion of the rights of others
- May damage school property
- Wearable technology and other attire when it interferes with instruction or student safety

# **Aersol Sprays**

We are experiencing an increase in students bringing and spraying aresol sprays during the school day (Axe, Bath and Body Works, Victoria Secrets, etc). These items are prohibited as the scents and sprays can cause asthma falr up as well as migranes in other student. Students may not use them or bring them to school.



# When Children Show Signs of Illness

Should I send my child to school or keep him at home? What is a Parent/Guardian to do? Deciding when your child is too sick to go to school can be a difficult decision for parents to make. When trying to decide, please use the guidelines below to help you.

- Diarrhea watery stools in a 24-hour period, especially if your child acts or looks ill.
- •Vomiting within the past 24 hours
- •Fever temperature 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. Remember that your child must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications prior to returning to school.
- Sore throat especially with fever or swollen glands in the neck. (With strep throat, the child may return to school after 24 hours on antibiotics)
- •Cough your child may bring in non-medicated cough drops. Cough drops may only be used for three days.
- •Appearance and Behavior unusually tired, pale, lacking appetite, difficult to wake, confused, or irritable.

•Eyes - thick mucus or pus draining from the eye or pink eye. With pink eye (conjunctivitis) you may see a white or yellow discharge, matted eyelids after sleep, eye pain, and/or redness.

•Greenish nose discharge and/or chronic cough - should be seen by a healthcare provider. These conditions may be contagious and require treatment.

Rash - body rash, especially with fever or itching.

Ear infections without fever – your child needs to get medical treatment and follow-up. Untreated ear infections can cause permanent hearing loss.

\*\*\*If your child shows any of the above symptoms while at school, the health room will contact those listed on your child's emergency contact list. Please be sure to have all contact numbers current.

# Message from the Health Room to Current 6th Grade Parents/Guardians

The Maryland State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene requires all incoming 7th grade students to have two additional vaccines at the start of the 2024-2025 school year:

- 1. Meningococcal Vaccine (MCV4)
- 2. Tdap Vaccine

Please contact your child's health care provider to obtain documentation of these vaccines or to schedule an appointment to receive the required above vaccines if still needed. If your child has not received the above vaccinations, please make an appointment with your child's doctor to do so and email or fax an updated immunization record once vaccines have been received. Having your child's updated immunization record prior to the end of this school year will help eliminate the possibility of exclusion from the start of school next year.

Immunization records can be faxed, emailed or brought to school by your child.

# Maryland State Medicaid must be renewed (not automatic renewals this year)

Changes are coming to Maryland Medicaid - this year, renewals won't be automatic. Individuals on Medicaid may no longer be able to continue receiving benefits if they have not completed their renewal. Here's what you can do now to prepare:

1. Update your contact information to make sure your current address, phone number, and email are on file so you'll get notices about

- changes to your coverage.
- 2. Open your mail and read any letters you get from Maryland Health Connection to find out how changes will affect you.
- 3. Take action to ensure you don't miss key deadlines. The letters will tell you what you need to do to get continued benefits.
